Free dental check-ups and treatment available!



Metro North Hospital and Health Service provides free oral health care to eligible **Queensland residents** and **Medicare Card Holders** including:

- All students 4 years of age through to year 10
- Students in years 11 and 12 who have a current Centrelink Card, Healthcare Card or Pension Card
- All 0-17 year olds who are eligible for the Child Dental Benefits Schedule (CDBS). To check your
 eligibility visit the website at <u>www.my.gov.au</u> or phone 132011
- All 0-3 year olds who are not CDBS eligible but whose parents have a current Centrelink Card, Health Care Card or Pension Card

The Oral Health team providing the service consists of a Dentist, Dental/Oral Health Therapists, and Dental Assistants. Most clinical procedures will be carried out by a Dental or Oral Health Therapist.

Dental examinations will soon be offered to all grades at your school. These will be conducted in the Dental Clinic at your school.

Please return your Offer of Treatment form to Caboolture State School office by Friday 22 March 2024 and you will be contacted for an appointment.

However, if any child is suffering from dental pain or you have a concern, please contact our centralised booking service on 1300 300 850.

A parent/legal guardian must attend the examination appointment. This is so that you can be involved in making decisions about your child's oral health care and discuss any issues that may be of concern.

Please remember to bring your child's Medicare Card to every appointment.
